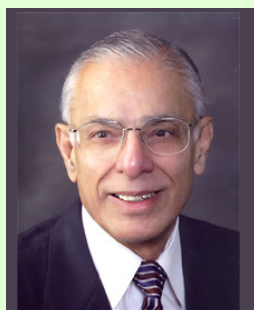

## Shahbudin Rahimtoola

M.B., F.R.C.P., M.A.C.P., M.A.C.C., D.Sc. (Hon)

Dr. Shahbudin Rahimtoola was born in Bombay, India and graduated M.B.B.S from Dow Medical College in 1954. He received the MRCP from the Royal College of Physician of Edinburgh in 1963 and he was awarded the Fellowship in 1972. He came to the United States in 1963 and became Co-Director of Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory at Mayo Clinic. He was Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Illinois and Chief of Cardiology, Cook County Hospital from 1969 to 1972, Professor of Medicine at the University of Oregon from 1972 to 1980. From 1980 to 1992, he was Chief, Division of Cardiology, University of Southern California.

In 1984, he was appointed the first George C. Griffith Professor of Cardiology. In 1993, he was awarded the title of Distinguished Professor, University of Southern California. He was Chairman, Council on Clinical Cardiology, American Heart Association and he was Trustee of the American College of Cardiology. Currently, he is a Distinguished Professor at the University of Southern California. He is also the George C. Griffith Professor of Cardiology and Chairman, Griffith Center, and Professor of Medicine. He is Editor-in-Chief of a book series, Current Topics in Cardiology.

He serves on the editorial boards of the Journal of the American College of Cardiology, Circulation and numerous other journals. He was Editor of Clinical Cardiology, a publication of JAMA and of Modern Concepts of Cardiovascular Disease, a publication of AHA. He has received numerous awards and citations including the Commissioner's Special Citation and Harvey W. Wiley Medal from the FDA. From the National AHA he has received Citations for International Service and for Outstanding Service; from the AHA Oregon Affiliate a special "Salute to Research" in 1985; and from the AHA Los Angeles Affiliate the Award of Merit and a Special Recognition for Outstanding Contributions to the study and practice of Cardiology. For teaching, he has received William Osler Award from the University of Miami; from American College of Cardiology, the Gifted Teacher Award in 1986; and from the International Society of Heart Failure, the Melvin L. Marcus Memorial Award as Gifted Teacher in Cardiology, in 1996.

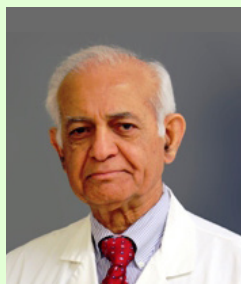
He received the James B. Herrick Award from the American Heart Association/Council on Clinical Cardiology in 1989. He gave the Bishop Lecture, American College of Cardiology, 1992. The American College of Physicians conferred on him Master of the College in 1996. He was appointed to the International Advisory Committee, Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences in 1997. He received the Distinguished Alumnus Award, Mayo Foundation in 1998. The American College of Cardiology conferred on him Master of the College in 1999. He received the Distinguished Scientist Award from the American College of Cardiology in 2001. He was awarded D.Sc. (Hon) by the University of Karachi in 2002.

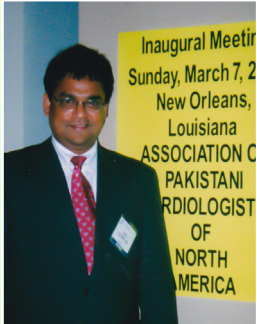

### Congratulations!

For many of us, the dream of having our own organization within the cardiologists community in North America became a reality on Sunday, March 07, 2004, in New Orleans during the ACC 2004. On this day, we had the inaugural meeting of the "Association of Pakistani Cardiologists of North America." We took the first step, but we have a long way to go.

Our respected senior colleague Dr. S. Sultan Ahmed moderated the meeting. Over forty colleagues attended the meeting. We were honored to have eminent researcher, scientists and cardiologists like Drs. A. Jamil Tajik and Shabuddin Rahimtoola on this occasion. Dr. Sheheryar Sheikh (Past President of Pakistan Cardiac Society and President Elect of World Cardiology Forum) from Lahore, Pakistan also joined the occasion.

Dr. Rahimtoola emphasized the importance of a two-pronged approach, one to help each other in North America and the second to help fight cardiovascular diseases in Pakistan. Dr. Jamil Tajik recalled the first conversation, which he had with me four years ago during another ACC meeting regarding forming such an association. He was glad to see the reality of APCNA and extended his full support. Dr. Sheheryar suggested having our own NGO in Pakistan. Other speakers were Dr. M. Suleman, Past President APPNA, Dr. Amin Karim from Houston who will be in charge of the communication committee, Dr. Arshad Jahangir from Mayo Clinic, Drs. Arjumand Hashmi, S. 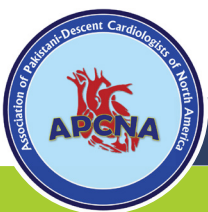

## APCNA 2004 - 2014

### APCNA came into existence that night

On March 7th, 2004, I was walking out of the elevator at the Embassy Suites Hotel in New Orleans on my way to attend the Annual Session of the American College of Cardiology, I saw two “Pakistani looking” physicians putting up a banner of a meeting of “Pakistani Cardiologists” that evening. I had never met Javed Suleman and Naushad Mohyidin (late) before that day. They invited me to attend this meeting. As they say, the rest is history ...

### The Foundation work of APCNA (2004)

*For many years Pakistani-descent cardiologists would run into their colleagues from the US and Pakistan at various meetings and kept saying to each other “we need to form an organization”. That Sunday in March 2004 we did just that.*

*About 35- 40 physicians attended the first meeting. Professor Sultan Ahmed moderated the meeting. We were fortunate to have Professor Jamil Tajik, Professor Shabbudin Rahimtoola, Dr. Sheberyar Sheikh from Lahore and Drs. M. Suleman, Amin Karim, Arshad Jahangir, Arjumand Hashmi, S. Nayyer Shamsi, Mahmood Alam, Fazalur Rehman in the meeting.*

### The following principles were adopted as guiding principles:

1. Keep it nonpolitical.
2. No place for regionalism, provincialism, linguistic bigotry in APCNA.
3. APCNA will complement APPNA and in no way will be a competing organization to it.
4. Keep it independent.
5. It should have not-for-profit status.
6. Annual meeting should be with ACC Annual session.

The achievements of an organization are the results of the combined effort of each individual.





**Our Annual Meeting has been held every year since then at the same time as the Annual Session of the American College of Cardiology.**

These were the formative years. A website was started and we embarked on a membership campaign.

To get us started we needed to find out how many cardiologists of Pakistani descent were in practice in North America. We approached the American College of Cardiology and developed a relationship with the college where we were designated as a "Friend of ACC". This allowed us to access some of the services that are reserved for the close working groups of the college.

I obtained a copy of the complete list of ACC members at a discounted rate. We extracted from this list any name, which sounded like they may be of "Pakistani-Descent"!

Over 700 hundred letters were mailed to everyone we identified on this list. The letter included an introduction to APCNA, a membership form and a link to our website. We

are sure there were dozens of physicians from India, Bangladesh and the Middle East who got these letters.

## The Constitution

Professor Sultan Ahmed and I were given the task of formulating the constitution and bylaws (CABL) of APCNA. It was then approved by the general body of APCNA in the annual summer meeting.

## The APCNA meetings & Events

Association of Pakistani-descent Cardiologists of North America (APCNA) held its inaugural meeting at the ACC Annual session in New Orleans, Louisiana. The distinguished Pakistani American Cardiologists, Prof. Shahbudin Rahimtoola, Prof. A. Jamil Tajik and Prof. S. Sultan Ahmed were among the attendees at the inaugural meeting.

## The objectives of APCNA

APCNA had two main objectives: 1) To provide support and information helpful to the needs of North American Cardiologists of Pakistani origin and to function as a platform for educational, charitable and cultural activities that allow members to share common ideas and discuss mutual concerns. 2) To contribute to the advancement of Cardiovascular Medicine in Pakistan and to form productive links with the physicians and cardiology community of Pakistan.

The General Body of the first meeting unanimously elected Dr. Javed Suleman as its first President. An organizing committee was formed and the cabinet was later expanded to name Secretary, Dr. Rizwan Karatela and Treasurer, Dr. Amin Karim. APCNA was incorporated in May 2004 in the State of Illinois with the tax ID # 20-1601525. An application for not-for-profit organization under section 501 (c) (3) was filed with Internal Revenue Service.

## The First Summer Meeting of APCNA

APCNA held its first summer meeting on June 12th 2004 in Washington DC. The Constitution & Bylaws of APCNA was presented by Prof. S. Sultan Ahmed, Chairman CABL Committee, and it was unanimously approved and adopted by the General Body. Committee chairs were announced including Drs. Naushad Mohyidin and Syed N. H. Shamsi as Chair and Co-Chair of the membership committee.

## The First APCNA Winter Meeting

First Annual Winter Meeting was held in Karachi. This was hosted by NICVD. Lectures and workshops were also held at Dow Medical College.

## APCNA Members Donated Cardiac supplies

Cardiac supplies valued at several hundred thousands of Dollars were donated by APCNA to these institutions. This was the first time that donations were given as a group. Over the years individuals had been taking supplies to Pakistan.

Azam Shafqat and Zahid Jamal from NICVD volunteered to be the implanting physicians in Pakistan at no cost to the patients.

It was not enough for APCNA to offer very expensive treatment such as cardiac stenting etc. to the patients in Pakistan. The EC agreed that APCNA should approach the Pakistan Government at its highest level to promote this idea. December 22 a delegation of APCNA leadership met with the President of Pakistan, Asif Ali Zardari. The delegation consisted of Drs. Javed Suleman, Rizwan Karatela, Arshad Rehan and Wajid Baig. 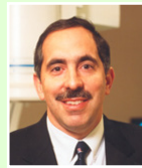

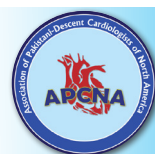

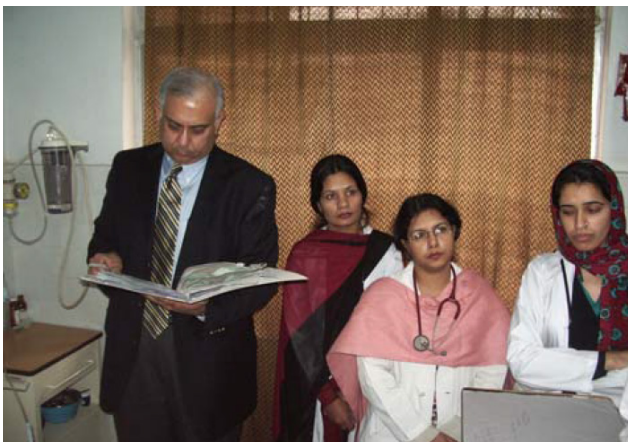
APCNA holds its Annual Meetings every year at the time of Annual ACC Convention and we call it **APCNA at the ACC**.

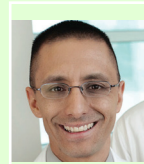

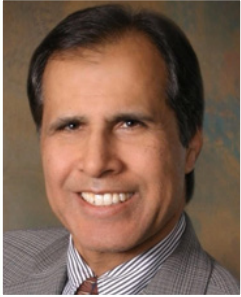

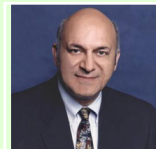

A The Dr. Masood Akhtar Memorial Lecture is a distinguished feature of the Association of Pakistani-Descent Cardiologists of North America (APCNA) Annual Meeting.

This lecture honors the legacy of Dr. Masood Akhtar, a world-renowned electrophysiologist recognized for his groundbreaking contributions to the field of cardiology. 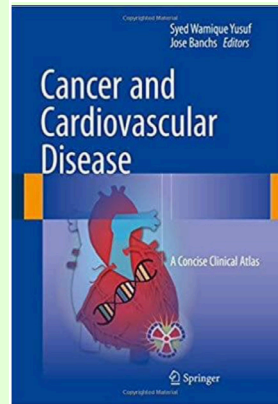

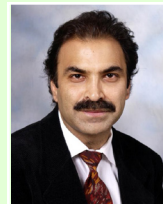


## APCNA congratulates Dr. Wamique Yusuf on publishing an atlas on Cancer and Cardiovascular diseases.



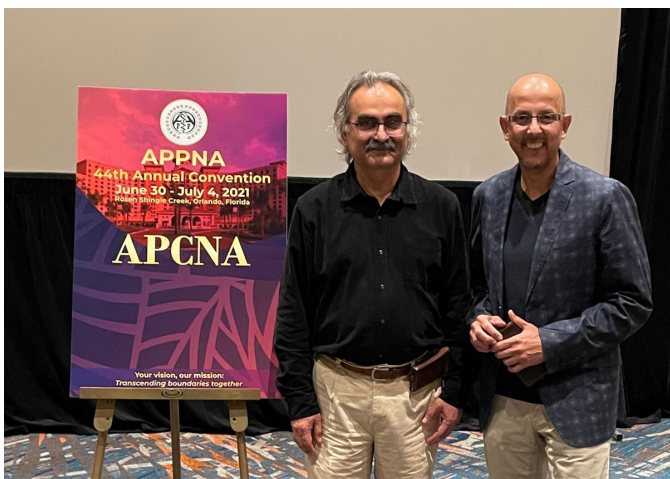

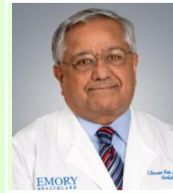

# APCNA Pacemaker Bank in Pakistan

*Every institution is known for its landmarks and events. APCNA Pacemaker Bank in Pakistan will be known as landmark project of APCNA. With the single objective to save lives of the people who can not afford such devices APCNA had no trouble getting the support from its membership. This is a perfect example of APCNA's Collaborative effort.*

## Background:

Healthcare for many people in Pakistan is quite limited. There are never enough resources available for the multitudes who may need care. Government intuitions are stretched to the limits. Many Charitable Hospitals and Clinics are doing a remarkable job trying to meet the shortfall. It is a credit to the physicians and healthcare workers in Pakistan who are able to provide care for these millions of patients with the limited resources available. The care for cardiac patients is even more difficult and most often not affordable for the poor. There are hundreds of patients who need permanent pacemakers and defibrillators but cannot afford them. Last year Dr. Suleman and I visited a major Cardiac Center in Pakistan where they had 10 temporary pacemakers, all were in use. They often wait weeks for a permanent pacemaker to become available. It is commendable that there are many cardiologists who are trying to provide free services and obtain pacemakers from various philanthropic sources. There was a dire need to provide these patients professional and financial assistance to make pacemakers available for them. Imagine a deserving patient in Pakistan who can now get a Permanent Pacemaker and Implantable Defibrillator at no cost to the patient! No charge to the patient from the physician, No charge for the device, No charge for the follow up.

## The Magnitude of the Need:

There are hundreds of patients who need permanent pacemakers but cannot get it and will die because they cannot afford it. It was noted that even the big public cardiac institution had only 10 working temporary pacemakers for the entire patient population they served. Patients had to wait for weeks to have permanent pacemakers implanted. Dr. Azam Shafqat, at NICVD showed some data collected by one of his fellows on the last 150 implants. The average salary of the patients was about 6000-8000 Rupees ( \$100-133) per month. The average waiting time for a permanent device with a temporary pacemaker in place was about 2 weeks. At today's rates a Permanent Pacemaker (PPM) implantation costs about Rs. 60,000-120,000 for the complete procedure. An ICD costs about Rs. 600,000 (Rs.6 Lakhs) and a Bivent- Defibrillator costs about Rs. 800,000 - 1, 200,000 (Rs.8-12 Lakhs), just the Defibrillator leads cost about Rs.100,000. While the pacemakers would be lifesaving measures for many patients the prohibitive costs for it would be unthinkable for many deserving patients to receive it.

## Inauguration: The First Pacemaker Bank in Pakistan

The APCNA-Rotary Pacemaker Bank was officially inaugurated on December 18th 2007, in Karachi. The ceremony at the Marriott Hotel was well attended by physicians, philanthropists, press and media. Several Rotary office bearers and members were in attendance. The CEO of Tabba Heart Institute, Ms. Maryyam Tabba, and NICVD's Consultant, Dr. Azam Shafqat (one of the implanting Cardiologists) were also present.

Heartbeat International (HBI) was represented by Mr. Ashraf Hasnain. President APCNA, Dr. Rizwan Karatela spoke about the continued commitment of APCNA's mission to helping the standard of healthcare and cardiology education in Pakistan. The APCNA Pacemaker Bank project director, Dr. Wajid Baig elaborated the APCNA's initiative in bringing about the establishment of the first pacemaker bank in Pakistan. He pointed out the important contribution it will have for the deserving patients in Pakistan. He reported that so far two PPM's and one ICD had been implanted. The Karachi Pacemaker Bank will cover all of Karachi as well as the Provinces of Sind and hopefully Balochistan. Dr. Baig further outlined the workings of the Pacemaker Bank and emphasized that the cost of the procedure such as hospital charges, consumable, travel and follow up will be covered by funds raised by the Rotarain's and our generous members. The first fund raising event is planned for March 2008.

## APCNA Collaborative Efforts

When APCNA members learned about such need in Pakistan, there was a palpable passion among the members to make a difference in lives of these patients. In March 2005, at the ACC Annual Scientific Sessions in Atlanta the as APCNA team we met Mr. Wil Mick, the President of Heartbeat International; a non-profit organization based in Tampa, Florida, the world's premier provider of free, cardiac pacemakers, im-plantable defibrillators and medical care to needy patients around the world. For more than 20 years, they have served the indigent and ill in more than 30 countries, reaching families and hearts around the world. Unfortunately, there was no such pacemaker bank in Pakistan. It was APCNA's initiative to approach Heartbeat International for establishing the pacemaker bank in Pakistan. It was apparent that the task was monumental, as according to the Heartbeat International, the Pacemaker Banks must adhere to strict operating principles and must comprise of qualified and experienced physicians, an appropriately equipped and staffed hospital, and a local Rotary club or approved Social Agency. APCNA needed to have partners who could facilitate this task become a reality. Fortunately, we had a good team of dedicated doctors, Dr. Bashir Hanif, Dr. Azam Shafqat and Dr. Zahid Jamal in Pakistan who were enthusiastic to provide such professional services. The Rotary Club of Pakistan provided us the needed support and the local institutions; Tabba Heart Institute and National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases (NICVD) opened their doors wholeheartedly for this worthy cause. The things then fell into place.

None of this could have happened without the hard work and dedication of Rotarian Ovais Kohari and his team. None of us are naïve enough to think that this one project will change everything for the patients in Pakistan. This is only a very small attempt to help these patients. It will take many more such projects to make a significant difference. We are proud that APCNA is making a start. What we are doing in Pakistan is just a start in terms of the needs of the deserving patients all over the country. We needed to start somewhere, and we have done so. Trying to improve the lives of even just a few patients will go a long way.

Help APCNA help the Poor Patients in Pakistan.

Over the last several years APCNA has worked extremely hard in establishing a transparent mechanism in which the deserving patients in Pakistan can get Permanent Pacemakers (PPM) and Implantable Cardiovertors Defibrillators (ICD's). These devices cost Thousands of US Dollars in North America and are beyond the resources available to a significant portion of the population in Pakistan.

Five years ago APCNA Partnered with Heartbeat International (HBI) in Tampa Florida and The Rotary Clubs in Karachi to set up the First Pacemaker Bank in Karachi. This Bank is one of the most efficiently run and successful projects jointly sponsored by Heartbeat International. Hundreds of devices have been implanted Totally Free of Cost to the patient at National Institute of Cardiovascular Disease's (NICVD) and Tabba Heart Institute (THI) in Karachi. Our experience in this project has led to the next phase in this endeavor.

In December 2011 we proudly inaugurated the Dr. Nawab Khan Pacemaker Bank. An APCNA-Rotary Peshawar Pacemaker Project This is a philanthropic project sponsored by the members of APCNA and the Rotary Club in Peshawar. Dr. Naeem Khan, a founding member and Trustee of APCNA has been leading this effort to honor the work his father did for decades to help the patients in and around Peshawar. Professor Hafizullah, Dean, Khyber Medical University has graciously taken on this project as an integral part of providing cardiac care to the poor patients of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa . This unique project is totally financed by donations from our members and the general public. In addition to donated Pacemakers that our members take to Pakistan; the Pacemaker Bank will be purchasing these devices in Bulk in Pakistan.

The Third phase of Providing Pacemakers to the deserving patients in Pakistan is a Joint Project with University of Michigan and APCNA. Our local Partner in Pakistan is Indus Hospital. Dr. Bari and his team last December hosted Dr. Thomas Crawford and our APCNA Leadership in Karachi for a site visit. It was clear that Indus Hospital is the ideal partner for this project. We are in the final stages of approval from the Sindh Health Department and the FDA in the US. Once these permits are issued; we have the opportunity to provide hundred's of Certified Refurbished Permanent Pacemakers to patients at Indus Hospital. Dr. Wamique Yusuf has been working with Drs. Kim Eagle and Crawford from the University of Michigan on this project.

Our next step is to start a Pacemaker Bank in Punjab. We are working hard on finding the appropriate partners and resources to make this a successful endeavor Please support these projects with your generous donations.

## APCNA Pacemaker Bank - Updates June 2024

### Pacemaker Bank Update June 2024

The report above was in 2020. The APCNA Pacemaker Bank has made many operational changes adapting to the realities on the ground:

✦ Maria Viqar, our Past-President and an Electrophysiologist is now a Co-Chair of the Pacemaker Bank. Her efforts and leadership have been exemplary and we are fortunate to have her in this role.

✦ Pacemaker companies are not donating devices anymore. Their manufacturing protocols have changed where they only make devices real time and not in bulk and store them. We remember when the device representative would carry the devices in the trunk of the Car and give it to the hospital as needed. Now the device is shipped overnight.

✦ Then came COVID-19. This changed many things. Unfortunately, it did not change the fact that patients were still getting sick, but devices were not available.

✦ Pakistan was now under Medtronic administratively from Turkey. The MECAT (Middle East, Central Asia and Turkey) region was no longer the local regional headquarters. We knew their managers well, now we had to get acquainted with others.

✦ We continued to look for avenues to do our best in continuing efforts to donate devices and were able to negotiate with the new team at Medtronic. Dr. Atique Mirza, our Past-President did a lot of hard work in making this possible.

✦ Since we do not get any more donated devices, APCNA members their friends and families are the source of our funding. Their generosity in keeping this life saving endeavor is truly heartwarming.

✦ Having looked at different companies and discussing with our colleagues in Pakistan, we decided that Medtronic is our best partner in Pakistan.

✦ We have negotiated new Prices for Devices, as one would expect, these are higher than our previous agreement.

✦ We collect the donations, transfer the funds to Medtronic and devices are delivered in batches of 10 to the hospitals that need them most.

✦ With the leadership from Past-President Saquib Samee, we added Tahir Heart Institute in Chenab, Punjab as an implanting site. Many of us have known and worked with Gen. Nuri who leads the Cardiac program at the hospital.

The need to help these deserving patients continues to grow. We are indebted to our donors for their response whenever we have approached them, they have responded. This marquee program of APCNA owes everything to our members and their donations.

Let us continue and grow this charitable project into the next decade. We have new leadership in APCNA. One can see how involved they are in continuing this project and looking in other ways to expand our charitable projects in Pakistan. A good example is the Stent-Bank project spearheaded by Kurram Moin, our Past-President and current Executive Director. I look forward to working with the dedicated team at APCNA continually expand our work as we look to establish more centers in Punjab and Baluchistan.

## Remembering Dr. Shahbudin Rahimtoola

Professor Rahimtoola passed away on December 10, 2018. Professor Rahimtoola was present at the first APCNA meeting in New Orleans when our Association was established. He was a Mentor to our Association. He personally brought cardiologists into our organization.

Dr. Shahbudin Rahimtoola was born in Bombay, India and graduated M.B.B.S from Dow Medical College in 1954. He received the MRCP from the Royal College of Physician of Edinburgh in 1963 and he was awarded the Fellowship in 1972. He came to the United States in 1963 and became Co-Director of Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory at Mayo Clinic. # APCNA BLS Training in Pakistan



One of the core mission of APCNA had been to establish Basic Life Support (BLS) training Centers in Pakistan. On December 18, 2008, APCNA conducted a full day course on BLS for health care providers at the Pakistan Medical Association (PMA) House in Karachi. Total of 45 participants successfully completed the course and were given certificate of completion. These participants then were recognized by the Palm Beach County AHA training center and received AHA BLS cards.

## In 2008

APCNA conducted full-day BLS training session at the PMA house Karachi for the health care providers. APCNA working with PMA over the past few months arranged the required equipment and teaching material to conduct the BLS course at PMA house. Set of 10 Adults, baby and infant mannequins, Ambu bags trainer AED, reading and test material were provided by APCNA. PMA organized the registration of health care providers to take the course.

## In 2009

Soon after the first main session at the PMA house in December 2008, the trainers at the PMA house were busy in holding sessions for BLS training on a regular basis and conducted several sessions through out the year training over 400 people.



### BLS Sessions in Remote Location

It was gratifying to note that two of the initial trainers at our initial session at the PMA house went on and held many sessions in Nawabshah and have trained hundreds in their institutions.

## Train the Trainers Program

APCNA BLS Training at the PMA House Karachi

The morning session consisted of "Train the Trainer" session where six physicians were identified by PMA to receive the training to be the trainer for the subsequent BLS courses at PMA house. Dr. Jamil Akhar was identified as the lead trainer. Other physicians who were trained as trainer included, Dr. Ghulam Nabi & Dr. Saleh Memon from Nawabshah, Dr. Chughtai, Dr. Afsheen Zaidi and Dr. Sultana Zafar. In the morning session these trainers were given the in-depth training to be able to become trainers. AHA guidelines of BLS training was strictly followed and on successful completion of the course these individuals were given the certificate of completion of the course. The afternoon session was conducted to provide BLS training for the health care provider. Total of 36 individuals registered for the course. Dr. Wajid Baig conducted the course with demonstration of the recommended AHA BLS training video with instruction key points APCNA BLS Training at PMA House explanation in between. This was followed by hands-on session to provide the skills training in BLS. Dr. Wajid Baig, Dr. Immad Sadiq and Dr. Rizwan Karatela supervised the course for the health care providers and also evaluated the new trainer in their skills as the trainer of the course. The candidates then were tested on the skills portion of the training and were signed off on each skills areas as noted on the AHA skills testing check list. The final session consisted of the written test required to pass for the BLS. In the end, the students were scored and were provided the feedback on the various key points related to the training. The evaluation forms were given to the participants allowed there feedback on the quality of the training course. All the successful candidate were given the certificate of completion.

# APCNA BLS Training - the seed planted ...

*A Model of Excellence in Service*

The BLS training center in collaboration with Pakistan Medical Association established at PMA House, Karachi was set an example of a model which would be replicated in the interior Sindh. With the initial donation of BLS training supplies worth about \$3800 arranged by APCNA the center was established to train few doctors who will in turn go back to their towns and train local healthcare workers in BLS.

We were very much impressed by two such dedicated doctors who wanted to help their communities in the interior Sind. As soon as they were train they were busy in planning the training sessions at their local institution. Within a matter of few months they had already trained >500 people..



**Dr. Muhammad Saleh Khaskheli and Dr. Ghulam Nabi Memon were the two among the doctors trained to be trainers. They went back to Nawabshah and trained over 500 health-care workers in BLS. They followed the same protocol for training, assessing, and certification requirement and kept the records.**

## Collaborative Effort in Basic Life Support Training for Health Care Workers in Pakistan.

*“Vision, leadership and commitment, led to make an impact on the training for Basic Life Support Program that will help millions.”*

Basic life support is offered by APCNA by Marriyam Moten MD, FACC, MPH, MHA, Professor of Medicine Loma Linda School of Medicine and University of California Riverside. She is the Chair of the APPNA MERIT cardiology committee section and past president of APCNA who emphasizes on education and primary prevention of cardiac disease.

This course is registered under the APPNA academy and is available for free for any medical students and recent graduates. It consists of 2 educational webinars of over 1.5 hours duration. These 2 educational lectures are meant to share knowledge among attendees about basic life support. Recognition of the need for CPR and the basic skills needed is also discussed along with discussions on how and when to use AED, relieve airway obstruction in anyone of any age, and basic treatment strategies as applicable in areas where the services are limited and where we as healthcare providers can make an impact on saving lives.

This course has per-lecture test questions, followed by a lecture and post-test for attendance with an explanation of the answer. Both the recorded lectures and slides are available

online for review by the registrants.

These webinars when conducted online have well over hundreds of participants with live questions and answers sessions. Each webinar is held on demand with a live speaker, moderator, and panelists from Pakistan and USA.

These webinars have been very well received as noted by the number of registrants, and their active involvement in Q&As and online chat. In addition, these webinars have perked up the interests of the Pakistani medical colleges who encourage their students to attend these online webinars BEFORE they provide hands-on training in their respective institutions and issue appropriate BLS certification after successfully completing the hands-on training and multiple choice questions as required for certification. In addition, some physicians in Pakistan have now taken formal AHA courses and become instructors on their own after attending these webinars. This shows a positive impact of the role of APCNA to further and improve cardiac healthcare in Pakistan with no financial burden on APCNA.

APCNA continues to welcome those who are interested in propagating BLS courses in Pakistan. In addition, there is now a demand to provide an ACLS lecture webinar series for Pakistan which we plan to initiate in the coming years.



# APCNA, University of Michigan and Indus Hosp

Each year millions of individual worldwide, die due to lack of access to permanent pacemakers. Conduction system disease, frequently affects younger patients in third world countries. APCNA has been working with Heartbeat International for the last few years, to provide new pacemakers to indigent patients in Pakistan. APCNA has highlighted the issue of pacemaker in Pakistan and our collaborative efforts in a letter to the Editor in Circulation.

Dr. Kim Eagle and his group, at the University of Ann Arbor, Michigan have started a research project "My Heart Your Heart", whose ultimate goal is to recycle used pacemakers, once approval from all regulators have been obtained. In the meantime, research is being conducted that will lay the groundwork for this potentially life-saving project. We as APCNA members are excited to be involved with this project.

Last winter Dr. Thomas Crawford (Assistant Professor, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor) and a leader of the University of Michigan research group project My Heart Your Heart visited Indus Hospital, Karachi for this project. Currently we are working on obtaining an approval from the Govt. of Pakistan for this project. This project will only be started once FDA and local government approval has been obtained. The aim of this project is to relieve human suffering in underserved areas of the world. Studies have shown that pacemaker re-use has an overall low rate of infection and we feel that with recycling used pacemakers, millions of lives can be saved world wide. We are very grateful to Dr. Kim Eagle and his team and in particular Dr. Thomas Crawford, who visited Pakistan with us December 2011.

## Collaborative Efforts in Preventive Cardiology in Pakistan: A Lifeline for the underprivileged.

### In 2023-2024

Preventive cardiology is a crucial field that focuses on reducing the risk of heart disease through early detection and lifestyle modifications. In Pakistan, where a significant portion of the population lacks access to basic healthcare, collaborative efforts in this field are making a profound impact. One of the landmark achievements in this regard has been the enhanced collaboration with the National Institute of Cardiovascular

# Food Is Medicine

He serves as a member of the Board of Governors (BOG), American College of Cardiology (ACC), and is the current Governor of ACC Tn. He is the co-chair of the ACC BOG task force for the Food in Medicine initiative.

**Several recent studies have pointed out the positive impact of such strategies on improved healthcare outcomes and costs. Cumulative supportive data is adding to the movement to implement food and nutrition interventions in the prevention, management, & even reversal of chronic disease.**

## An apple a day!

### Food for thought or Paradigm shift.

Chronic health conditions such as Diabetes, Hypertension, and Coronary artery disease account for significant healthcare costs, morbidity, and mortality. Healthcare expenditures increase exponentially with each chronic illness. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that 90% of all healthcare costs in the United States go towards treating chronic disease, about 3.7 trillion dollars a year.

There is increasing evidence that a diet rich in processed foods, added sugar and salt contributes to several chronic health conditions. Diet-related chronic health conditions are the leading cause of death and disability in the United States and worldwide and account for almost 20% of mortality. This global epidemic of diet-related chronic disease, associated mortality, and their costs of care has prompted many health professionals to consider using food as a strategy for patient care and disease management.

### Food is Medicine

Food is Medicine (FIM) is a broad initiative to prioritize integrating specific food and nutrition interventions with standard healthcare strategies in the management, prevention, and amelioration of chronic disease. FIM is focused on increased consumption of a variety of whole, minimally processed, plant-based foods and limited intake of highly processed foods rich in sugar, oil, and salt.

### Food is Medicine Interventions.

Food is medicine interventions currently include three strategies. Medically tailored meals. Medically tailored groceries. Produce prescriptions.

#### *Medically tailored meals:*

These are fully prepared meals designed by a professional based on individual assessment of the patient. These recipients are with complex medical diagnoses such as HIV, cancer, or advanced Heart failure and are unable to shop or prepare meals.

#### *Medically tailored Groceries:*

Medically tailored groceries are non-prepared grocery items selected by a nutrition professional

as part of a treatment plan. These are typically collected at a clinic or community point and prepared at home and are designed for recipients with cardiometabolic conditions such as diabetes mellitus, hypertension, and cardiovascular disease. The recipients can prepare food at home.

#### *Produce Prescriptions:*

Produce prescriptions include vouchers or debit cards for free or discounted produce. They are usually distributed by healthcare providers and restricted for produce purchases. They are appropriate for the broadest number of recipients for both disease prevention and management.

### Elements for FIM Program Success

#### *Clinician education:*

Nutrition education is sub-optimally covered in medical curricula. Healthcare professionals receive less than 1% of lecture hours on this subject. For FIM initiatives to be equitably available to all patients, it is imperative that such education be a part of medical Curricula.

#### *Research and Data:*

Robust randomized trials are needed to study the long-term effects of FIM initiatives on health indices and costs of care. Similar studies are needed to study the comparative efficacy of different options on a long-term basis and address the scale and duration of such interventions.

#### *Funding For FIM:*

Widespread implementation of FIM programs would require sustainable funding, either private or Public. Positive data on FIM programs on costs of care for chronic disease would have a favorable impact on policy regarding healthcare spending on FIM as a viable part of integrated healthcare programs.

# APCNA Handheld Echo Project

## Background and Inception:

The Handheld Echo Project was initiated in March 2023 as a collaborative pilot project between the Association of Pakistani Cardiologists of North America (APCNA) and the National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases (NICVD) in Karachi. The primary objective of this project is to address the significant gap in access to quick and accurate cardiac diagnostic services in remote and underserved areas of Karachi and Sindh.

### Objectives

- ♦ **Rapid Cardiac Diagnosis:** To provide immediate and reliable cardiac assessments to patients in outpatient settings.
- ♦ **Accessibility:** To reach remote and underserved populations who otherwise have limited access to specialized cardiac care.
- ♦ **Efficiency:** To enhance the operational capacity of cardiac clinics by integrating portable echocardiography technology.

### Implementation.

APCNA has equipped ambulatory cardiac clinics and outpatient departments (OPDs) run by NICVD with advanced handheld echocardiography probes. These devices are highly portable, making them ideal for use in varied clinical settings, including those with limited infrastructure.

- ♦ **Daily Operations:** Each handheld echo probe performs approximately 20-25 echocardiographic studies daily, significantly boosting the diagnostic throughput of the clinics.
- ♦ **Team Leadership:** The project is spearheaded by Dr. Sabah Bhatti of NICVD, along with a dedicated team of healthcare professionals committed to delivering high-quality cardiac care.

### Services Provided

The project offers comprehensive echocardiographic evaluations, which include:

- ♦ **Assessment of Heart Function:** Evaluating the pumping efficiency of the heart.
- ♦ **Detection of Cardiac Abnormalities:** Identifying structural and functional abnormalities of the heart.
- ♦ **Monitoring Chronic Conditions:** Ongoing monitoring of patients with chronic cardiac conditions to manage and adjust treatment plans.

### Expansion Plans

Given the success of the pilot phase, there are ambitious plans to expand the Handheld Echo Project across Pakistan. The expansion strategy includes:

- ♦ **Scaling Nationwide:** Extending the reach of the project to underserved communities throughout the country.

- ♦ **Training Programs:** Implementing comprehensive training programs for healthcare providers in remote areas to operate the handheld echocardiography devices effectively.
- ♦ **Partnerships:** Collaborating with additional healthcare institutions and organizations to support the expansion and sustainability of the project.

### Impact

The anticipated impact of the Handheld Echo Project is substantial:

- ♦ **Improved Access to Care:** Bridging the gap in access to cardiac diagnostic services for remote and underserved populations.
- ♦ **Early Detection:** Enabling early detection and intervention for cardiac conditions, which can significantly improve patient outcomes.
- ♦ **Healthcare System Efficiency:** Enhancing the overall efficiency of the healthcare system by reducing the burden on centralized hospitals and providing timely care at the community level.

In summary, the Handheld Echo Project represents a significant advancement in the delivery of cardiac care in Pakistan, leveraging innovative technology to provide timely and accurate diagnoses to those who need it most.

### **Cardiology Supplies:**

**More than 5 million dollars worth of donations for patients.**

The cardiac supplies collected and brought by APCNA members are certainly greatly appreciated by the local faculty who diligently care for these patients with meager means.

### **First Pacemaker Bank in Pakistan:**

**Hundreds of Pacemaker for the deserving non-affording patients in Pakistan.**

It took a lot of effort on the Part of Dr. Wajid Baig to work in collaboration with Heartbeat International, Tampa, FL. To set up the First Pacemaker Bank in Karachi. Over 250 devices implanted so far in the deserving patients who could not afford these devices.

### **CCU teaching rounds.**

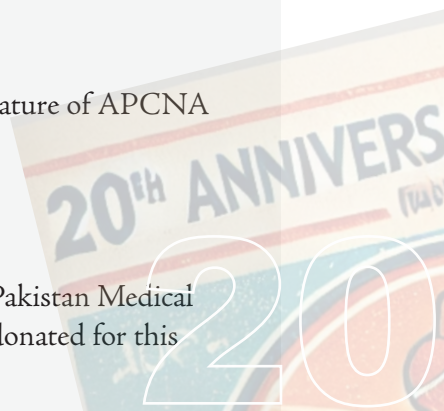
**Annual sessions at various medical colleges in Pakistan**

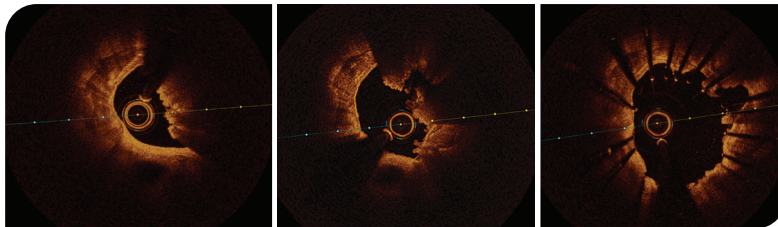

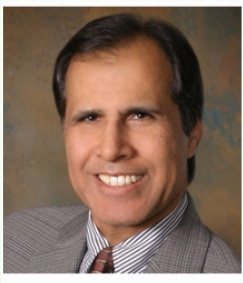

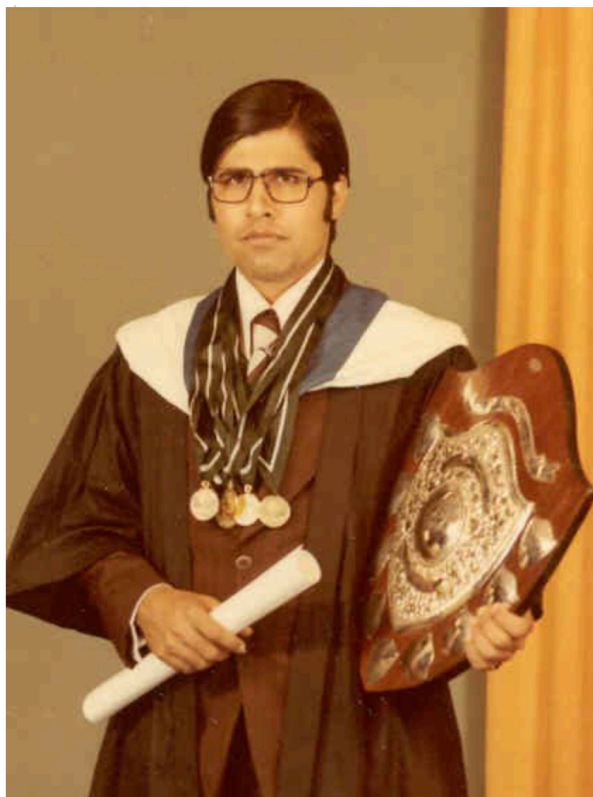

## Karachi doctor earns honour in U.S.

NEW YORK, June 6: A Pakistani doctor's paper won the first prize at a recent meeting of the American College of Physicians in Baltimore, Maryland, according to information reaching here.

The work of Dr. Amin H. Karim, a 1978 graduate of Karachi's Dow Medical College, was adjudged the best among the 54 papers submitted.

The paper described a case report and discussed the rationale for a new treatment of a potentially lethal complications from anti-psychotic treatment with drugs like Bichlopromazine (Largactil) and Haloperidol. Called the "neuroleptic malignant syndrome", it presents as high fever and rigidity of the body in patients who have been using these drugs for the control of schizophrenia.

Dr. Karim, working with the neurology department of the Sinai Hospital and John Hopkins University, Baltimore, was in the team

which tried a drug called Bromocriptine to break the rigidity. This drug is used for Parkinsons' disease, but had never been used for the neuroleptic syndrome.

Another new drug called dantrolene was used to reduce the body temperature. The treatment was said to have proved successful and patients recovered from the condition which had proved to be fatal in many patients.

Dr. Karim's paper was highly applauded by the President of the American College of Physicians and the Professor of Medicine at Harvard's Medical School, Dr. Daniel D. Federman, and head of Maryland's chapter of the American College of Physicians, Dr. Jan H. Muholland.

Dr. Karim is the assistant chief of medicine at the Sinai Hospital, Baltimore. He came first when he graduated from the Dow Medical College, capturing seven gold medals. —APP
